Diploma of Distinction:

Summer Study Abroad Experience:

- Students will complete an educational travel abroad experience

Required Core Courses: (will satisfy MA State requirements)

- English (AP Literature, AP Language)
- Social Studies (AP World, AP US History)
- Math: Economics, Statistics (Calculus and AP level courses will be encouraged)
- Science: Higher level courses (e.g., Physics, Anatomy and Physiology)
- 2 – 4 electives focusing on communication, international business and global issues
