MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS



Greetings Randolph Public Schools Parents and Community,

We are well into March and I hope that the harsh winter weather is behind us as I am sure we are all looking forward to spring. The recent news reports regarding policies around travel bans/immigration and transgender students have caused me to reflect more on my role as Superintendent, as a father and as an American. While I watched this year's Academy Awards one recipient read a statement that included these words, "... filmmakers can turn their cameras to capture shared human qualities and break stereotypes of various nationalities and religions; they create empathy between us and others, an empathy which we need today more than ever." Like the filmmakers with their cameras, we as parents and educators have the opportunity to influence the world by motivating our children to have an educated, unbiased perspective on life.

In my more than 50 school/classroom visits this year, I continue to be proud of our students and staff. Throughout the year I have seen excellent examples of quality teaching and learning. Students at the secondary level have been engaged in discussions that included lessons on poetic elements, the Pythagorean Theorem, a



Rhombus and around the political process. Elementary students are having lively discussions focusing on ribosomes, mitochondria, narrative writing and how to make the "T" sound.



Here are some events and important work that are taking place at Randolph Public Schools.

RPS Highlights:

- The Global Leadership Academy: in partnership with Emerson College, students apply in 8th grade. Students will be required to take a minimal of 4 Advanced Placement courses, 4 years of a World Language, complete 120 hours of community service, complete an internship and a capstone project and participate in a travel abroad opportunity for at least 2 summers.
- Fire Academy (Randolph High School): in partnership with the Randolph Fire Department, students receive training that leads to certification and job opportunities.
- Instrumental music has been expanded to allow elementary students to participate in band in their school either before or after school (contact your child's principal).
